
Access to Himi Himi City is located in the northwest of Toyama Prefecture, at the base of Noto Peninsula. It looks onto Toyama Bay, a member of the "World's Most Beautiful Bays To Wakura Hot Spring Resor Club." The city has a population of about 50,000, and fishing and agriculture are its (Nanao City, Ishikawa Pref.) main industries. Himi has relatively mild weather due to warm currents along the coastal area. Thanks to the opening of the Hokuriku Shinkansen, the traveling time from Tokyo has been reduced to about three hours, and access to other cities has also improved. It takes about 50 minutes by car to go from Himi to Toyama Airport, a gateway to the Hokuriku region, which has regular flights to Taipei, Shanghai, Dalian and Seoul. Access by public transportation

- Expressway bus: Direct bus from Tokyo (Busta Shinjuku) and Nagoya (Meitetsu Bus Center) to Himi City.
- Express bus: "Waku Liner" runs from Takaoka Station and Shin-Takaoka Station to Himi Ban-ya gai. "Toyama Buri-kani Bus" runs from Toyama Station to Himi Ban-ya gai.
- Local Bus: Services available to Himi from Takaoka Station and Shin-Takaoka Station. Rental car: Available at Takaoka Station and Shin-Takaoka Station

Tateyama Kurobe Alpine Route

Mountain route that traverses the base of the 3,000-meter high Japan North Alps by bus, cable car, and ropeway. There is wonderful nature to see along the way.







21st Century Museum of Contemporary Art, Kanazawa
